



## Robert Gene "Bob" McClure

April 15, 1933 - August 10, 2023

Robert Gene McClure (Bob or Poppy to those who loved him most) 90 of St. Albans went home to be with his Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ on August 10, 2023. Bob joins his beloved wife Betty, his son Rodney, his mother Zena, his father Raymond, his brothers Paul and Jimmy and his sister, Adeline Nelson in heaven.

Bob was born on April 15, 1933 in Griffithsville, WV. He lived his early years in Lincoln County graduating from Duval High School. He met the love of his life Betty, at the age of 15 and they were married August 25, 1954. They shared 61 wonderful years together before she passed in 2015. Bob proudly served in the Army during the Korean War, training in boot camp at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri and was later stationed at Fort Kilmer, New Jersey. He chose welding as his profession and went to trade school in Aberdeen, Maryland. He was a top seller for Flavorite Cookware, worked on the pipeline for CJ Hughes and retired from Don's Disposal after in 1998.

Bob and Betty lived in New Jersey during his time in the Army before returning to St. Albans, WV where he lived the next 70 years on Coal River Road. In 1955 their daughter Robyn was born and in 1956 their son Rodney was born. Bob was saved and baptized while attending New Hope Baptist Church. In 1980 Bob and Betty began attending Maranatha Fellowship Church where he has remained a faithful member until the time of his heavenly homecoming.

Poppy's pride and joy were his grandchildren. They spent many summers and weekends with their Poppy and Granny. He took them to church, the state fair and many buffet lines. He loved westerns, mowing the grass, deer hunting, Tudor's biscuits, The Golden Corral, good coffee, and gardening. At one time he had two gardens, one as big as an acre. Bob had many friends. He looked forward to every phone call and visit from them. He will be remembered for so many things including his strong hand-shakes, bear hugs, and peppermints.

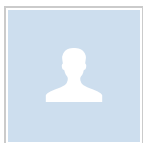
