Sue Ann Davis, 91, of St. Albans, passed away peacefully on August 10, 2025, at Hubbard Hospice House.

Born on June 3, 1934, to Fallie and Eva Pauley, Sue Ann grew up in Boone County before her family settled in St. Albans. A proud 1952 graduate of St. Albans High School, she began her career at Chesapeake & Potomac Telephone Company before marrying the love of her life, Harry Benton Davis, a U.S. Marine Corps veteran.
