Virginia "Carol" King, 86, of St. Albans, went home to be with the Lord on December 16th, after a long illness. She was surrounded by her family as she peacefully entered the gates of heaven.

Carol was born November 9, 1938 to the late Frederick and Francis (Walker) Ingram of Charleston. She was a 1957 graduate of Stonewall Jackson High School in Charleston WV. After graduating Carol would go on to work at Cox's department store in St. Albans WV, as well as the Eye and Ear Clinic and Shawnee Hills Rehabilitation Center in Charleston WV.

Carol was married to her beloved husband of 56 years, the late John King. Together, along with their daughter Susie, through John's service in the United States Army, they would live in many places including Germany, before settling in St. Albans WV in 1967.

Carol was a devoted wife to John, as well as mother to her only child, Susie, and grandma to her two adoring grandkids Audra and Isaac. Her most beloved role, besides that of wife, mother and grandma, was that of being a child of God. Carol was a long-time member of Abney Street Church of God in St. Albans, WV, where she was very active through the years, singing in the choir, and teaching Sunday School, as well as being involved in other ministries within the church.
