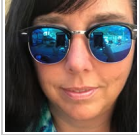

There's countless memories with all of his family and mine.

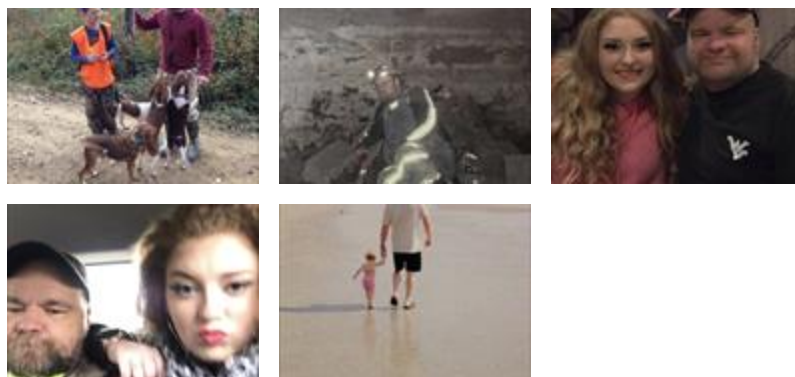
William was a phenomenal father, great friend to many, and a hard worker throughout his life.
